Our Foundation

Clay Target Shooting has existed in Western Australia since the 1940s and the State Association was affiliated with the ACTA so that WA competitors could participate in competition at state, national and international level.

The sport had good growth after World War II with the largest club in Perth and a number of affiliated clubs in country WA

Our greatest growth, along with international recognition, came in the early 1980s when the Association, along with the Western Australian Gun Club took up an area in Whiteman Park and developed some of the best Clay Target sporting facilities in Australia. The Whiteman Park grounds have the capacity to conduct Olympic and Commonwealth events both in Trap and Skeet, ISSF, DTL and Australian Skeet.

The Association, along with member clubs, have conducted two World standard competitions and a number of Australian National Championships

WACTA has a formal process to administer the sport, allocate State championships and supply \clay targets to member clubs in Perth and regional WA. The Association also conducts State tournaments and is responsible for the overall development of the sport on behalf of its affiliated Clubs and members in WA

As well as providing opportunities for strong competitive sport from club to international level, clay target shooting is an active sport that includes participation by people of all ages, gender, disability, cultural background and religious beliefs

Clay target shooting has a rich history and strong traditions that provide the foundation for the operation, development and growth of the sport today. A primary objective of WACTA is the encouragement and advancement of the sport in WA as a recreational activity and has a major role to play in providing leadership for the sport in the state.

This strategic plan recognises the important work of the past and builds upon a strong foundation. The plan sets out the main priorities that the Western Australian Clay Target Association will pursue during the next three years to ensure the sport of clay target shooting continues to develop and grow into the future

Our Vision

- To foster, promote, encourage, and develop the sport of clay target shooting and the formation of clay target shooting clubs within WA.
- To be recognised as the premier Clay Target Association in Western Australia with International standing for hosting National and International Events.
- To increase participation in the sport at all levels of competition.

Our Mission

- The Western Australian Clay Target Association is the administering body of Clay Target Shooting in WA and is affiliated to the Australian Clay Target Association Limited.
- Our aim is to provide a safe, enjoyable environment that encourages all participants to reach their full potential in their chosen sport, including international representation and to further develop Clay Target shooting in the state.
- We will do this by providing the best possible facilities and Clubs, together with providing pathways for competitors to reach elite status in the sport.
- We will source quality clay targets, at reasonable pricing, to support affiliated clubs to further develop the sport in their region.
- Our success will be measured by the pride our members take in the Association, their club and the role models we produce within our community.

Strategic Direction

In the development of this plan, WACTA has used the SMART approach to undertake a sensible assessment of the organisation's capability, capacity, expertise and resources to develop and achieve a set of realistic strategic objectives.

The assessment has been undertaken not to lower expectations but to ensure that WACTA, its members and the sport of clay target shooting is able to get the best results from the efforts expended. The plan presented sets out the strategic direction of WACTA for a three-year horizon.

The WACTA plan focuses on seven key strategic objectives. These are:

- Promote safety, education and training.
- Increase the WACTA membership ratio of participants in the sport.

- Build revenue in support of financial sustainability.
- Act as an intermediary body for the consultation of issues affecting clay target shooting in Western Australia.
